48 March 30, and the ballot election will be conducted from April 23 to April 30 as specified in the schedule.

71 the Learning Environment Committee (LMU)

72 *Case responsible: The Election Committee*

73 **Purpose:**

74 Elect three representatives to the learning environment committee and four substitutes. The position will
75 accede on 1st of July 2025 and will last for one year.

76 **Background:**

77 The learning environment committee shall contribute to a good study and learning environment at the
78 university and ensure that the physical and mental learning and working environment is justifiable based
79 on an overall assessment of students' health, safety, and welfare. The learning environment includes all
80 factors that affect students' well-being, and which are within NMBU's area of responsibility, except for
81 the academic study offer. It also includes student welfare and student-social conditions at the institution.
82 LMU has at least two meetings during the semester, where, among other things, it recommends the use
83 of 3.6 million, which is to be spent on major LMU measures on campus. LMU also adopts the distribution
84 of smaller LMU measures, works with action plans around the learning environment, and follows up on
85 surveys such as. The SHoT survey and the Study Barometer.

86 The students are represented as half of the committee members, four out of eight members. Three of the
87 student representatives are elected by the Student Parliament, and the last representative is from AU.

120 *Case responsible: The Election Committee*

121

122 **Purpose:**123 Elect a permanent representative and two substitute representatives to the Research Committee. The
124 position will accede on 1st of July 2025 and will last for one year.

125

126 **Background:**127 The Research Committee is NMBU's highest research policy body and shall provide advice and strategic
128 input to the University Board, Rector and Vice - Rector for Research, in matters concerning research,
129 innovation and dissemination. Typical issues you work with are research infrastructure, researcher
130 education, student-active and student-initiated research, and research publication. The Research
131 Committee has approx. eight meetings evenly distributed throughout the year. In addition, there are
132 usually two seminars a year.

133

134 FU is led by the vice-rector for research and innovation, who is currently Finn-Arne Weltzien, and the
135 secretary is the research director Vitalis Pavlovas. Furthermore, the committee consists of the research
136 leaders / vice-dean for research and innovation for each of the seven faculties, a temporary scientific
137 employee proposed by the vice-rector, two students, two PhD candidates appointed by the doctoral
138 association at NMBU (SoDoc), and one employee in technical and administrative position.

139

140 The position is remunerated, including two hours with AU. In advance.

173 The leader has overall responsibility for the Sustainability Committee. In addition to leading the
174 committee and ensuring effective follow-up of its initiatives, the leader will have overall responsibility
175 for planning and executing Green Week each spring, an important event that focuses on sustainability at
176 the university through various activities. Furthermore, the leader will be responsible for communicating
177 with relevant partners. The leader is responsible for calling committee meetings, sending out the agenda
178 in a timely manner, and filling the agenda with engaging and exciting topics. The AU representative serves
179 as the vice-leader of the committee, and the leader is also responsible for determining the size and
180 composition of the committee.

205 **Purpose:**

206 Allocate welfare funds to clubs and associations at NMBU.

207 **Background:**

208 Once per semester, the Student Parliament distributes welfare funds to clubs and associations affiliated
209 with NMBU. This year, NOK 506,290 will be distributed. 92% and refunded funds from 2024 (a total of
210 NOK 496,215) will be distributed at ST2 (see attachment: Overview of funds 2025).

211 The distribution of welfare funds is regulated by the “Regulations for the Allocation of Welfare Funds,”
212 which was adopted at ST2 2024. The committee has consisted of the following members:

- 213 • Welfare Fund Manager in AU: Oskar Solberg Lægland (committee chair)
- 214 • Welfare Manager in AU: Marthe Sponberg
- 215 • Financial Manager in the Society Board: Egil Natvik Vestrheim
- 216 • A student representative on the SiÅs board: Liz Mwangi
- 217 • A person who has previously participated in the allocation: Ragnhild Sunde Stokke
- 218 • Representative elected by the Student Parliament: William Fredrik Bakke Dahl
- 219 • Representative elected by the Student Parliament: Martin Hansebråten

220 The support from the welfare funds is divided into three categories: basic support (general operational
221 support for all associations), start-up support (extra support for new associations), and activity funds
222 (support for individual activities, upon application with a budget). The attachment “Proposal for the
223 Distribution of Welfare Funds” shows the committee’s recommendation for the distribution of all funds,
224 while the attachment “Proposal for the Distribution of Activity Funds” shows which associations and
225 activities we propose to allocate activity funds to.

226 A total of 62 applications have been received, with a total amount of NOK 974 414. Since only NOK
227 496,215 is to be distributed this time, including basic support, the committee has had to prioritize quite
228 strictly. In addition to the rules from the regulations, the committee has used the following guidelines to
229 assess the applications:

- 230 • Applicants with Open Association status have been prioritized in the allocation.
- 231 • Applicants who have submitted good applications and an overview and accounts for last year’s
232 allocated funds have been prioritized in the allocation.
- 233 • Applicants who have ethical guidelines and attended the welfare fund workshop have been
234 prioritized.
- 235 • A maximum of NOK 3,000 for annual meetings, general assemblies.
- 236 • Activities related to Fadderuka and August in general have been deprioritized. Exceptions are
237 events from open associations that the committee has considered a good supplement to the usual
238 activities during this period.
- 239 • Pre-parties and info-pre-parties have not been allocated funds as a measure following the results
240 from SHOT where students express a desire for fewer activities centered around alcohol.
- 241 • Christmas parties are reserved for line associations and open associations.
- 242 • Funds for info evenings, stands/recruitment have been deprioritized.
- 243 • Associations with more than NOK 100,000 in assets are deprioritized in the allocation of activity
244 funds.

416 to phase out the salary grade system. With the current agreement, this means that the Executive
417 Committee's salary will not be adjusted. Therefore, it is desirable for the Student Parliament to make a
418 decision stating that the Executive Committee's salary development should follow the general salary
419 increase at NMBU. For 2025, this means an adjustment of 2.7%.
420

422 The Student Parliament adopts that the Student Board's salary should be adjusted to the same level as
423 the general salary increase at NMBU.

994 **Chapter 1: Purpose and Scope**

995 **§ 1-1 Purpose**

996 The Student Democracy at NMBU has the purpose of protecting the students' interests and
997 bringing forward their inputs.

998

999 **§ 1-2 Scope**

1000 These statutes apply to all organs of the Student Democracy at NMBU and are constructed in accordance
1001 with national laws and regulations. Instructions taken up in chapter 8 cannot go against these statutes.

1002

1003 **Chapter 2: Structure of the Student Democracy at NMBU**

1004 **§ 2-1 At a Central Level**

1005 The highest democratic organ in the Student Democracy at NMBU is the Student Parliament. The daily
1006 operations of the Student Parliament are carried out by the Student Parliament's Student Board.

1007

1008 **§ 2-2 At a Faculty Level**

1009 At the Faculty level, the Student Democracy consists of Student Councils. Student Councils are
1010 constructed of the committees and positions that come from the model for Student Councils approved
1011 of at Student Parliament 6 on 14.11.2016.

1012

1013 The Faculty general assembly is the highest student democracy organ at a faculty level. Between faculty
1014 general assemblies the student councils stand for the daily operations and representations of the faculty's
1015 student democracy.

1016

1017 The Student Council at Campus Adamstuen is delegated the power of communication and
1018 representation over the Welfare Committee in Oslo and Akershus.

1019

1020

1021 **Chapter 3: The Student Parliament**

1022 **§ 3-1 Powers and Functions**

1023 The Student Parliament represents all students at NMBU, and decisions made in the Student Parliament
1024 are made on the behalf of all students. The Student Parliament has the responsibility to inform about
1025 decisions made. Closing of the meeting must follow the provisions in §3-7.

1026
1027 **§ 3-2 Composition**

1028 The Faculties at NMBU are constituents of the Student Parliament. The Student Parliament consists of
1029 25 representatives. These representatives are distributed according to the democracy model approved
1030 of at Student Parliament 6 in 2016.

1031 The division method for the mandatory seat allocation follows this formula: V

1032 2^{s+1}

1033
1034 V = Number of students at the faculty

1035 S = Number of student representatives the faculty is allocated

1036
1037 Updated number of students can be found in the Database for Statistics on Higher Education (DBH)
1038 every fall. The average of the number of students for the spring semester and fall semester make up the
1039 basis for the following year's representative distribution in the Student Parliament.

1040
1041 This calculation basis is presented for orientation before the fall faculty general assemblies.

1042
1043 **§ 3-3 Election of representatives**

1044 Student Parliament representatives and substitute Student Parliament representatives are elected for
1045 one (1) year at a time at open student general meetings in each faculty. The date for the general meetings
1046 is decided as a general rule in the date plan adopted by the Student Parliament. The Student Council
1047 head and deputy head are responsible for the implementation of the general assembly at their faculty.

1048
1049 The choice is made by written or digital voting. If there are not more candidates than the number of
1050 positions, the election can be carried out by acclamation. One must try to ensure representation from
1051 several genders and different fields of study.

1052
1053 **§ 3-5 Meetings and Summoning**

1054 The Student Parliament must hold at least 3 meetings per semester. The Student Board is responsible
1055 for summoning the Student Parliament. Summoning and case papers should be made available to all
1056 students at least 7 days before the meeting. Electronic decisions are the exclusion of this statute cf. §3-
1057 11.

1058
1059 The provision that the summoning and case papers need to be made available for all students in the first
1060 paragraph entails that they need to be translated to English. If there is uncertainty about the translation,
1061 the Norwegian version will be the basis for understanding. Further specification is outlined in the
1062 instructions for the Student Parliament.

1063
1064 All students with a valid semester registration have the right to send in cases to the Student Parliament.
1065 This must be done at the latest 14 days before the meeting if the case is to be handled. This provision does
1066 not count for cases to be handled under "other." Further specification is outlined in the instructions for
1067 the Student Parliament. Extraordinary Student Parliaments is held if at least 3 members of the Student
1068 Board, at least 13 representatives from the Student Parliament, or at least 25 students desire it.
1069 Extraordinary Student Parliament is to be made known to the public at least 7 days before taking place
1070 and should only handle the case(s) that were the reason for its summoning.

1071

1072 **§ 3-6 Representation at the**

1073 Representation at the Student Parliament

1074 The following people are required to attend Student Parliament, and are required to give a written
1075 notification before the meeting if they cannot attend:

- 1076 - The Student Parliament's Representatives
- 1077 - The Student Parliament's Student Board
- 1078 - The Student Parliament's organizational secretary
- 1079 - The Student Parliament's chairmen

1080

1081 At least one representative from the following organs must attend the meeting:

- 1082 - The Student Representative in the University Board
- 1083 - The Student Representative in the SiÅs board
- 1084 - The International Student Union (ISU)
- 1085 - The Control Committee

1086 All students at NMBU have the right to attend the Student Parliament.

1087

1088 **§ 3-7 Closing of a Meeting.**

1089 The Student Parliament's meetings are open. The Student Parliament can decide to close a meeting with
1090 a qualified majority from the representatives in attendance. Translators or other support functions can
1091 stay in the meeting if at least one of the student parliament representatives requires them to.

1092 With the closing of a meeting, separate minutes will be recorded that are withheld from public
1093 disclosure.

1094

1095 **§ 3-8 Decision Validity**

1096 The Student Parliament can make valid decisions when at least 50% of the representatives are in
1097 attendance.

1098

1099 **§ 3-9 Voting rights and Voting**

1100 The Student Parliament's representatives have a voting right. If a main representative notifies of an
1101 absence, their appointed substitute has a voting right when in attendance. Decisions in the Student
1102 Parliament are normally made with a 50% majority. Decisions are made with hand raising, unless one
1103 representative asks for a written voting. With a voting tie, the Student Parliament can take a new vote.
1104 With a continued tie after a second voting, the case can be handled according to the proposed
1105 resolution.

1106

1107 **§3-10 Speaking and Proposal Rights**

1108 Everybody has a right to speak at Student parliament meetings. All students at NMBU has the right to
1109 propose cases at Student parliament meetings.

1110

1111 **§ 3-11 Electronic Voting**

1112 Electronic voting can be used to make decisions about single cases. Electronic voting is carried out in
1113 the method described in the instructions for electronic voting. The deadline to vote electronically is
1114 within 7 days.

1115

1116 Electronic voting cannot be used to vote on matters concerning the following:

- 1117 - Elections
- 1118 - Cases of mistrust
- 1119 - Changing to the Student Parliament's committee documents and instructions
- 1120 - Appointment of the student representatives to councils and committees
- 1121 - Other matters of considerable nature

1122 Main Student Parliament Representatives have voting rights with electronic voting.

1123
1124 Electronic voting cannot take place if one or some student parliament representatives wish to handle
1125 the case at a normal student parliament before the deadline. The desire must be justified.
1126

1127 **§ 3-12 Position Resignation**

1128 The Student Parliament representatives automatically resign from their position in the Student
1129 Parliament when they are elected to the following organs:

- 1130 - The Student Parliament's Student Board
- 1131 - The University Board
- 1132 - The SiÅs Board
- 1133 - The Student Board of the Norwegian Student Organization
- 1134 - The Control Committee

1135
1136 Student Parliament representatives also automatically resign their seats if they are no longer students
1137 at the university.

1138 If a Student Parliament representative changes faculty, that person can remain in office until
1139 supplementary elections can be held at the next general meeting. In that case, they will remain in office
1140 as a representative of their old faculty. Alternatively, they may resign their seat.

1141 With position resignation, the position holder's deputy representative automatically inherits the
1142 position as a main representative.

1143 **§3-13 Temporary Position Resignation**

1144 In the case of partiality, there will be a temporary place resignation. This means that the representative
1145 withdraws from their position in cases where it applies. In the case of temporary place resignation the
1146 deputy will take over cf. § 6-1
1147
1148

1149 **Chapter 4: The Student Parliament's Student Board**

1150 **§ 4-1 Powers and Functions**

1151 The Student Board (AU) carries out the Student Parliament's daily operations and represents the Student
1152 Parliament between meetings. AU can make decisions in urgent cases, cases that are delegated due to
1153 earlier decisions in the Student Parliament, and appoint people to non-decision making committees. AU
1154 makes proposals in all cases handled by the Student Parliament, with the exception of Elections.
1155
1156

1157 **§ 4-2 Composition**

1158 The Student Parliament's Student Board shall consist of the following members:

- 1159 - President
- 1160 - AU member
- 1161 - AU member

1162
1163 The Student Board constitutes their areas of responsibility internally. Working time

1164 and election periods are regulated according to functions § 5-1.

1165 **§ 4-3 Decision Ability and Voting Ties**

1166 The Student Board can make valid decisions when at least four members are in attendance. With a voting
1167 tie in the Student Board, the president has a double vote.
1168

1169 **§ 4-4 Editorial authority**

1170 Usually, The Student Board has editorial authority to correct typographical errors in all adopted
1171 documents, unless otherwise decided by the Student Parliament. The authorization only applies to
1172 minor linguistic changes. Changes in the content can only be made by a new decision in the Student
1173 Parliament. The date of changes must be listed at the top of the document, under information about
1174 when the document was adopted.
1175
1176

1177 **Chapter 5: Elections and Appointments**

1178 **§ 5-1 Eligibility for the Student Democracy**

1179 The overarching rule is that all Students at NMBU with a valid semester registration can run for
1180 positions in the Student Democracy. This applies unless otherwise specified.
1181

1182 **§ 5-2 Electronic Ballot Elections**

1183 a) Election of the Student Parliament's Student Board

1184 The Student Parliament's Student Board are elected through Electronic Ballot Voting, where all students
1185 with a valid semester registration have the right to vote. The Electronic Ballot Election take place in
1186 April every year. They hold their position for 1 year, between 1.7. until 30.6. Candidates who apply must
1187 be able to master Norwegian as a working language.

1188 b) Election to the University Board

1189 Two student representatives are elected, one of each legal gender, with a deputy. They are chosen
1190 through an Electronic Ballot vote, where all students with a valid semester registration have the right
1191 to vote. The election takes place every year in April/May and in November. They hold the position for
1192 one year, from 01.07 to 30.06 for the spring election, and 01.01-31.12 for the fall election.
1193

1194 c) Elections to the Faculty Board

1195 Two student representatives, on of each legal gender, are elected with personal substitute to the seven
1196 Faculty Boards (FS). These are elected by electronic urn election, where all semester- registered
1197 students at the relevant faculty have the right to vote. A student only has the right to vote in one faculty
1198 board election. The Electronic Ballot election takes place every year in April / May and November. The
1199 position time for the elected is 1 year and lasts from 01.07. to 30.06 for the spring election, and 01.01-
1200 31.12 for the autumn election. Candidates of a gender other than the representative who already sits on
1201 the board are eligible to stand for election at a given semester.
1202

1203 **§ 5-3 Other elections and appointments conducted in the Student Parliament**

1204 The Student Parliament elects student representatives to positions that are described in the Framework
1205 for the Working Year. All elections are done by writing. In the case that only one candidate is running
1206 for one position, they can be elected by acclamation, unless at least one representative wishes to have a
1207 written voting process.

1208 With a tie in voting between two candidates, a new voting round will be held. With a continued tie after
1209 a new voting round, the decision will be made according to the proposed resolution. If there is no
1210 suggestion made the decision will be made by drawing lots. Those chosen in this paragraph have minute
1211 requirements to the Student Parliament.
1212

1213 **§ 5-4 Resignation of position and Supplementary Elections**

1214 Normally, a supplementary election will be held in the case of place resignation from positions elected
1215 by the Student Parliament. Supplementary elections follow the same election rules as normal elections.
1216 This can be adjusted in cases of urgent votes, a short time left of the time period of the position, or other
1217 reasons in which it is appropriate.

1218 In the event of a resignation from a position elected at a general meeting, the substitute member will

1219 move to the permanent position. Alternatively, the Student Council can appoint a temporary
1220 representative who sits until the next general meeting. This also applies if positions are empty because
1221 they were not filled at the general meeting, as long as the general meeting has not decided otherwise.
1222

1223 **§ 5-5 Resignation of position in the Student Board**

1224 If a leader or member of the Student Board resigns during the term of office, the Student Parliament
1225 appoints a temporary member. The election is made according to the same election rules that apply to
1226 ordinary elections in the Student Parliament.

1227 In the event of resignation before the autumn ballot election, the temporary member sits until a new
1228 member is elected in the ballot election. In the event of resignation after the autumn ballot box election,
1229 the temporary member sits for the remainder of the period and until a new Student Board takes office.

1230 If the leader resigns, the leader's deputy will become acting leader until a new leader is elected by ballot.
1231

1231

1232

1233 **Chapter 6: Impartiality**

1234 **§ 6-1 Impartiality**

1235 For someone to be "partial" entails that there are circumstances that are likely to cause bias in
1236 the person's judgment. This can happen when a person is a part of a case or has strong personal
1237 consequences from the results of a case, or has close family with the previously mentioned.

1238 In order to have good administrative practices, questions of partiality must be strict. This means that a
1239 lot must happen to name a representative partial. Those that are named partial must temporarily
1240 resign from the case, cf. § 3-12.
1241

1242 Cases of partiality are handled with a 50% majority voting from the relevant organ, and the person in
1243 question cannot vote. If more than one person in a case is questioned about partiality, none of the
1244 involved can partake in voting about their own or others' partiality, unless the organ is no longer a
1245 decision making organ in the case. In this case, all meeting members can participate.
1246

1246

1247

1248 **Chapter 7: Mistrust**

1249 **§ 7-1 Mistrust**

1250 Issues of mistrust can be brought up by Student Parliament representatives or other organs of the
1251 Student Democracy, and should be delivered to the Student Parliament's organizational secretary. When
1252 handling these issues at the student parliament, the one that the case is brought up against has the
1253 opportunity to present their own case.
1254

1254

1255 **§ 7-2 Ability to ask for a statement from the control committee**

1256 If cases where mistrust are brought forward, both parties can ask for a statement from the control
1257 committee in sufficient time before the case is handled.

1258 **§ 7-3 Issues of mistrust against the representatives chosen by the student parliament** With a
1259 2/3 majority vote amongst representatives in attendance, the student parliament can decide that
1260 an officer is mistrusted, following statutes §§ 5-1 second paragraph, and 5-3. Those who are deemed
1261 distrusted must immediately resign as an appointee from the student parliament

1262 **§ 7-4 Issues of mistrust against the representatives chosen by Electronic Ballot Voting.** Student
1263 Parliament can with absolute qualified majority decide mistrust against representatives elected by §§5-2 a and c.
1264 Those who have cases of mistrust approved against them must resign immediately from their position.

1265

Cases of mistrust cannot be taken against student representatives in the University Board, as it goes against *Lov om universiteter og høyskoler* § 9-8. (The laws for Universities and Higher schools)

The statutes outrank all other management documents.

§ 8-1-2 Program of Principles

1294

The Program of Principles determines the organization's ground principles and executive political priorities. The Program of Principles outranks the rest of the Student Parliament's politics.

1297

The Program of Principles shall be treated every 5th year. The Student Parliament can choose to treat the Program of Principles at any time. The Program of Principles shall be treated in two student parliament meetings: with a discussion case in the first meeting and a decision case in the second meeting.

§ 8-1-3 Political platforms

1302

Political platforms determine what the Student Parliament thinks of a certain topic. These shall not go against the Program of Principles, but outside of this, political platforms outrank the rest of the Student Parliament's politics. A document is valid for 5 years. Political platforms shall be processed in two student parliament meetings: with a discussion case in the first meeting, and a decision case in the second meeting.

§ 8-1-4 Resolutions

1309

Resolutions stipulates what the Student Parliament believes in a particular case. Resolutions can be processed directly. If the Student Parliament requires it, a decision can be made even if the resolution is sent in after the case paper deadline. In that case, The Student Parliament have to decide during the constitution with a qualified majority (2/3 of the votes) if they want to make a decision in the case.

1315 **§ 8-3 Other Instructions**
1316 The Student Parliament can approve of other instructions as needed.
1317

1319 **Chapter 9: Dissolution of the Student Democracy at NMBU**

1320 **§ 9-1 Dissolution**
1321 Dissolution of the Student Democracy at NMBU must be approved of with a qualified majority amongst
1322 present representatives for two consecutive student parliaments. The decision goes into effect after the
1323 second meeting is adjourned. Proposals for dissolution must be made at least 4 weeks before it is
1324 handled for the first time, and the first student parliament meeting that handles the case is to be an open
1325 meeting where all students at NMBU are called in.

1326
1327 **§ 9-2 Merging with Other Student Democracies**
1328 Merging of the Student Democracy at NMBU with other student democracies must be approved of with
1329 a qualified majority amongst representatives in attendance for two consecutive meetings. Proposals for
1330 merging must specify the point in time at which the merge will take place.

1333 **Chapter 10: Membership in the Norwegian Student Organization**

1334 **§ 10-1 Membership in the Norwegian Student Organization**
1335 The Student Democracy at NMBU is a member of the Norwegian student organization (NSO).
1336 Withdrawal must follow the protocol of NSOs statutes.
1337

1338
1339 **Chapter 11: Amendments to the Statues**

1340 **§ 11-1 Submitting of Amendment Proposals**
1341 Proposals for amendments of these statutes should be taken to the Student Parliament's Student Board
1342 at least 14 days before the meeting in which they will be addressed, and needs to be made public to all
1343 students at least 7 days before the meeting.

1344
1345 **§ 11-2 Decisions and Effectiveness**
1346 With a qualified majority vote amongst representatives in attendance, the Student Parliament can decide
1347 that changes go into effect immediately after they are adopted

1348
1349 With a qualified majority, the Student Parliament can bring changed into effect. The Student
1350 Parliament's Student Board has the power to make editorial changes in these Statutes. Such changes
1351 must be presented for orientation during the first meeting after they are made.

1354 **Chapter 12: Definitions**

1355 **§ 12-1 Majority Voting**
1356 Simple Majority: This means that a proposal receives the most votes
1357 50% majority: This means that a proposal receives more than ½ of the votes from participating voters

1358 Qualified Majority: This means that a proposal receives 2/3 or more of the votes from the
1359 participating voters

1361 Absolute Majority: A proposal receives more than ½ of the total number of votes Absolute
1362 Qualified Majority: A proposal receives 2/3 or more of the total number of votes

2529.11 Attachment 11 Resolution Empowering Students at Risk

Empowering Students at Risk (StAR)

Students are key agents of change in any society. They are on the front lines of the fight for democracy, fundamental human rights and more just societies. In this fight, students face great resistance, brutal attacks, persecution, imprisonment, surveillance, and they are often denied the right to study. This is a problem that is growing larger as authoritarian forces advance and new measures are introduced to silence activists and critical voices.

Students at Risk (StAR) is a scheme for students who, due to their work protecting human rights, are at risk and/or are denied the right to education in their home country. Through StAR, students are given the opportunity to come to Norway and complete their education here.

StAR is an important program in the fight for democracy, freedom of expression and human rights that provides protection to key actors in this fight – namely the students. The scheme was initiated by the Norwegian Student Organization (NSO) and the Students and Academics International Aid Fund (SAIH) in 2012 and established as a program in 2013. The first students came to Norway in 2015. The scheme is funded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and administered by the Directorate for Higher Education and Competence (HK-dir). Today, Norway accepts up to 20 students a year through this scheme at universities and college campuses throughout the country. The last two years have seen a significant increase in the number of qualified students, with over 70 nominated in both 2022 and 2023. It is thus clear that the need for programs far exceeds the current financial framework. In recent years, we have also seen increasing interest in the scheme internationally. Establishing similar schemes in other countries is important to meet the growing need. This will open opportunities for students who do not meet the Norwegian requirements for English proficiency, as well as students with study backgrounds that are not compatible with programs at Norwegian higher education institutions.

It is important to acknowledge the challenging situation that Students at Risk students find themselves in when they arrive in Norway. A particular concern is the lack of adequate psychosocial support for StAR students. Several struggle with major trauma and psychological difficulties after having been exposed to threats, persecution and oppression in their country of origin. The combined effect of several challenges upon arrival in Norway, such as integration, limited access to mental health services, and uncertainty about the future, places additional psychological pressure on individuals who are already in a vulnerable situation. There is a need for networks and to create a supportive and safe environment that gives StAR students the opportunity to offer their professional ambitions and further develop their human rights work in Norway and internationally through networking and competence building.

Proposed resolution:

The Student Democracy at NMBU believes that the Students at Risk scheme must be strengthened and the number increased to at least 40 per year.

The Student Democracy at NMBU will work for:

- That measures are established to ensure psychosocial support for Students at Risk students at NMBU.
- NMBU offers more places for Students at Risk.
- To promote the Students at Risk scheme in international forums and encourage similar initiatives.
