35 **Purpose:**

36 The purpose of this briefing is to inform all students at NMBU about the positions up for election in the  
37 spring election and the opportunities they have to run as early as possible.

38  
39 **Background:**

40 An electronic election will be held for a new AU (one president and two members), a female  
41 representative to the University Board, and female representatives to the Faculty Boards. The deadline  
42 to submit a candidacy is set for March 25, and the electronic ballot election will be conducted from April  
43 22 to April 29<sup>th</sup> as specified in the schedule.

60 2624 Elections and Appointments

61 2624.1 Election of Election of 3 main and 4 substitute representatives to  
62 the Learning Environment Committee (LMU)

63 *Case responsible: The Election Committee*

64  
65 **Purpose:**

66 Elect three representatives to the learning environment committee and four substitutes. The position will  
67 accede on 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2026 and will last for one year.

68  
69 **Background:**

70 The learning environment committee shall contribute to a good study and learning environment at the  
71 university and ensure that the physical and mental learning and working environment is justifiable based

72 on an overall assessment of students' health, safety, and welfare. The learning environment includes all  
73 factors that affect students' well-being, and which are within NMBU's area of responsibility, except for  
74 the academic study offer. It also includes student welfare and student-social conditions at the institution.  
75 LMU has at least two meetings during the semester, where, among other things, it recommends the use  
76 of 3.6 million, which is to be spent on major LMU measures on campus. LMU also adopts the distribution  
77 of smaller LMU measures, works with action plans around the learning environment, and follows up on  
78 surveys such as. The SHoT survey and the Study Barometer.

79 The students are represented as half of the committee members, four out of eight members. Three of the  
80 student representatives are elected by the Student Parliament, and the last representative is from AU.

## 88 2624.2 Election to the University's Research Committee (UFU /NMBU FU)

89 *Case responsible: The Election Committee*

90  
91 **Purpose:**

92 Elect a permanent representative and two substitute representatives to the Research Committee. The  
93 position starts on 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2026 and will last for one year.

94  
95 **Background:**

96 The Research Committee is NMBU's highest research policy body and shall provide advice and strategic  
97 input to the University Board, Rector and Vice - Rector for Research, in matters concerning research,  
98 innovation and dissemination. Typical issues you work with are research infrastructure, researcher  
99 education, student-active and student-initiated research, and research publication. The Research  
100 Committee has approx. eight meetings evenly distributed throughout the year. In addition, there are  
101 usually two seminars a year.

102  
103 FU is led by the vice-rector for research and innovation, who is currently Finn-Arne Weltzien, and the  
104 secretary is the research director Vitalis Pavlovas. Furthermore, the committee consists of the research  
105 leaders / vice-dean for research and innovation for each of the seven faculties, a temporary scientific  
106 employee proposed by the vice-rector, two students, two PhD candidates appointed by the doctoral  
107 association at NMBU (SoDoc), and one employee in technical and administrative position.

## 118 2624.3 Election of the Leader of the Sustainability Committee

119 *Case responsible: The Election Committee*

120

121 **Purpose:**122 To elect the leader of the Sustainability Committee. The position starts on July 1, 2026, and lasts for one  
123 year.

124

125 **Background:**126 The leader has overall responsibility for the Sustainability Committee. In addition to leading the  
127 committee and ensuring effective follow-up of its initiatives, the leader will have overall responsibility  
128 for planning and executing Green Week each spring, an important event that focuses on sustainability at  
129 the university through various activities. Furthermore, the leader will be responsible for communicating  
130 with relevant partners. The leader is responsible for calling committee meetings, sending out the agenda  
131 in a timely manner, and filling the agenda with engaging and exciting topics. The AU representative serves  
132 as the vice-leader of the committee, and the leader is also responsible for determining the size and  
133 composition of the committee.

146 **Purpose:**

147 Allocate welfare funds to clubs and associations at NMBU.

148

149 **Background:**150 Once per semester, the Student Parliament allocate welfare funds to organizations and associations  
151 connected to NMBU. This year, a total of **NOK 696,467** will be allocated, of which **92% (NOK 640,750)**  
152 will be distributed at ST2 (see attachment: Overview of Funds 2026).

153

154 The distribution of welfare funds is regulated by the “**Regulations for Allocation of Welfare Funds**”,  
155 adopted at ST2 2024. The Committee for Allocation of Welfare Funds has used these regulations to  
156 propose a distribution of funds for this semester (see attachments 2 and 3). The committee has consisted  
157 of the following members:

- 165 The support from the welfare funds is divided into three categories:  
166 • **Basic support** (general operational support for associations)  
167 • **Start-up support** (additional support for newly established associations)  
168 • **Activity funds** (support for individual activities, following application with budget)

169  
170 Attachment 2, "*Proposal for Distribution of Welfare Funds*", shows the committee's full recommendation  
171 for the distribution of all funds, while attachment 3, "*Proposal for Distribution of Activity Funds*", shows  
172 which associations and activities we propose to allocate activity funds to.

173  
174 A total of **63 applications** were received, amounting to **NOK 829,611**. Since only **NOK 640,750** is  
175 available for allocation this time, including basic support, the committee has been required to prioritize.  
176 In addition to the rules in the regulations, the committee has used the following guidelines when  
177 assessing applications:

- 178 • Applicants with **Open Association** status were prioritized.  
179 • Applicants who submitted strong applications, as well as clear documentation and accounts for last  
180 year's allocated funds, were prioritized.  
181 • Applicants who attended the **welfare funds workshop** were prioritized.  
182 • Maximum **NOK 5,000** for annual meetings/general assemblies.  
183 • Maximum **NOK 3,500** for cabin trips (NMBU cabins).  
184 • Activities related to **Fadderuka** and August in general were deprioritized.  
185 • **Vors** and **info-vors** have not been granted funds.  
186 • **Christmas dinners** are reserved for line associations and open associations and may receive a  
187 maximum of **NOK 6,000**.  
188 • Funds for **information evenings, stands/recruitment** have been deprioritized.  
189 • Associations with more than **NOK 100,000** in assets were deprioritized for activity funds.  
190 • Applicants without **approved ethical guidelines** have not received support this year.

191

#### 211 **Purpose:**

212 To review and update a previously adopted resolution, now including the amendments adopted at  
213 Student Parliament Meeting 1, as well as some rewriting to align the text with the adopted changes.  
214

215 **Background:**

216 The Student Board has reviewed older and outdated resolutions from the Student Parliament. In this  
217 process, we have identified several resolutions that are still relevant and should therefore be brought  
218 back to the Student Parliament.

219  
220 The Vego Standard Resolution from 2019 is considered still relevant. The Student Board therefore wishes  
221 for the Student Parliament to assess whether it should be re-adopted. The resolution has been updated  
222 to reflect the current situation and ensure that the content is up to date.

223 It was brought to Student Parliament Meeting 1, where several amendment proposals were adopted. It  
224 was further decided that the resolution should be rewritten to incorporate the new amendments before  
225 being brought to Student Parliament Meeting 2 for adoption.

226 The adopted amendments have been incorporated into the resolution.

227  
228 Other changes are marked in **light blue** to indicate new additions.

229  
230 **Proposed decision:**

244 The Student Parliament shall discuss proposed revisions to the rules for the Student Parliament's  
245 Inclusion Funds.

246

247 **Background:**

248 The Student Parliament's *inclusion funds* aim to increase the inclusion of international students and are  
249 distributed monthly by the Inclusion Funds Committee to activities that seek to bring together  
250 international and Norwegian students here at NMBU. The rules for the Student Parliament's Inclusion  
251 Funds are revised by the Student Parliament every even-numbered year. The revision shall be discussed  
252 at ST-1 and potentially adopted at ST-2. The proposed amendments in the document were written by the  
253 chair of the Inclusion Funds Committee, based on comments from the committee and the discussion item  
254 at ST-1.

255 Additions are marked in **blue**, deletions are marked in **purple**, and relocation changes are marked in  
256 **yellow**.

257

258 **Proposed Decision:**

259 The Student Parliament adopts the new "*Rules for Inclusion Funds*" as presented in attachments 5 and 6  
260 (6 is a new document without marked changes).

297 The Student Democracy's Date Plan/ Schedule includes the most important dates and events throughout  
298 the year, such as the Student Parliament meetings (typically 6 per year), the Autumn and Spring Student  
299 Electronic Ballot Elections, as well as the Student Democracy's Kickoff Conference in the spring. The Date  
300 Plan/ Schedule is approved at Student Parliament Meeting 3 of the previous year, which means that the

302 Parliament meeting after this, namely Student Parliament Meeting 3.

316 **Purpose:**317 Discuss how the Student Parliament believes NMBU and our ELSA representatives should relate to HUJI  
318 (the Hebrew University of Jerusalem) and its membership in the ELLS alliance.

319

320 **Background:**321 NMBU is a member of the EuroLeague for Life Sciences alliance (ELLS), and two student representatives  
322 from NMBU are also represented in the ELLS Student Association (ELSA). ELLS has 10 member  
323 universities and two partner universities, of which one is the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in Israel  
324 (HUJI).325 In light of Israel's invasion of Gaza in 2023, and HUJI's connection to the Israeli military (IDF), students  
326 from other ELLS universities have raised questions about HUJI's membership status in the ELLS alliance.  
327 (See attachment x for additional information.) At present, NMBU has not taken a strong stance on this  
328 matter. NMBU's ELSA representatives wish to know how the Student Democracy wants both us and  
329 NMBU to position ourselves regarding HUJI's membership in the ELLS network.

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388 **Resolution – Equalization of vegetarian and meat dishes at NMBU.**

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*Adopted at Student Parliament Meeting xxxxxxxx*

Norwegian meat consumption has more than doubled between 1959 and 2021. At the same time as agriculture has become increasingly industrialised, climate change is causing more extreme weather, the polar ice is melting, sea levels are rising, crops are drying out, and species are going extinct faster than ever before. We are experiencing a climate crisis and are on track to exceed the 1.5-degree target. Reduced meat consumption alone will not save the planet, but it will be an important contribution.

NMBU has a strong focus on climate. As Norway's sustainability university, we should take the lead in creating a more climate-friendly university and college sector, including when it comes to food services. Equal treatment of vegetarian and meat-based food will be a natural way to show that we as a university take the climate crisis seriously and promote sustainability in action — not just in words.

In practice, this means that dishes with meat and dishes without meat are treated equally. When ordering food for an event, the selection must be 50/50 plant-based and meat-based — unless all participants specify what they want. This is instead of treating requests for meat-free food as a special preference similar to allergies, as is currently the case.

**The Student Parliament wants:**

- NMBU to introduce equal treatment of vegetarian and meat-based food at all events where food is served.
- Local ingredients to be prioritised whenever possible.
- NMBU and SiÅs to improve the quality of vegetarian food so that nutritious, high-quality meals are served.
- To lead by example by introducing equal treatment of vegetarian and meat-based food within the Student Parliament itself.

### 441 Objectives:

442 The inclusion funds' main objective is to promote the inclusion of international students in the student  
443 environment at NMBU. The inclusion funds contribute to this by creating contact between Norwegian  
444 and International students, and to give International and Norwegian students an arena to share  
445 knowledge involving culture, language, and history.

### 446 Who can apply?

447 **Both individual students, All** groups and associations from NMBU can apply for funding, including  
448 Studentsamfunnet I Ås. **Individual students can also apply for funding, but organizations are prioritized.**

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## 451 1. The application process:

### 452 1.1 Deadline and process:

453 **The deadline for application is the 5th every month. The deadline for application is the 15<sup>th</sup> every**  
454 **month.** Should the set deadline fall on a holiday or weekend, the deadline will be the first working day  
455 after the holiday or weekend. Applications submitted after the deadline will not be processed **until the**  
456 **following month.** The applications will be proceeded by the inclusion funds comitee, and the **funds will**  
457 **be transferred** the response to the application will be received **within the 15<sup>th</sup> 25<sup>h</sup> every month.** All  
458 grantings of the iclusion funds will be public. This includes which association, planned activity, and the  
459 amount of funds granted.

### 460 1.2 Application:

461 **If you have any questions about the application process, contact the international officer in the Student**  
462 **Board.**

463 • An application has to be sent through Nettskjema **on Studentsamfunnet/ressurser-midler.** The  
464 International Officer is responsible for the application form.

465 • Decisions made by the committee are final and cannot be appealed.

466 • Applications will not be processed in July.

- 467 • The applicant must advertise the activities in both English AND Norwegian.  
 468 • Students applying for larger social/pro-active activities will be prioritized  
 469 • The committee of Inclusion Funds will take into account the number of applicants, and assess according  
 470 to what activities that they believe will facilitate the most cultural exchange between Norwegians and  
 471 Internationals.  
 472

### 1.3 Requirements for the applicant and the application:

- 473 • The funds must be used for socio-cultural activities.  
 474 • The application and the report must be written in English.  
 475 • For organizations applying: Use the bank account that belongs to the organization, not a private account.  
 476 • The application must contain a budget with explanations for each post.  
 477 • The applicant must seek to make as many students as possible benefit from the activities for which it is  
 478 applying.  
 479 • Activities on or close to campus have a higher priority in the distribution of funds. However, activities  
 480 organized further away where the target is cultural/language exchange may still qualify for funding.  
 481 • Activities that are free for participants are given higher priority in the distribution of funds. Entry fees  
 482 are only permitted when justified and must be reasonable, non-exclusionary, and limited to covering  
 483 additional costs directly related to the specific event.  
 484 • Closed or internal activities may be considered as long as the target is cultural/language exchange.  
 485 • Only upcoming events can be applied for. Exceptions can be made by the committee under special

1053 **Background to discussion case- HUJIs membership in the ELLS alliance**

1054  
1055 **What are ELLS and ELSA?**

1056 The EuroLeague for Life Sciences (ELLS) is an alliance of European universities committed to life sciences  
1057 for sustainability. Rooted in scientific excellence and societal engagement, ELLS drives the  
1058 transformation of agri-food systems through collaboration in education, research, and innovation. ELLS  
1059 has ten member universities in Europe, including NMBU, and two partner universities outside of Europe:  
1060 Lincoln University in New Zealand and the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in Israel (HUJI).

1061  
1062 The ELLS Student Association (ELSA) is made up of two representatives from each member university  
1063 (with voting rights) and one observing representative from partner universities. The primary aim of the  
1064 ELSA group is to ensure that the student voice is included in decisions made by ELLS and to raise student  
1065 issues through the appropriate channels. At present there are representatives in ELSA from all  
1066 universities except HUJI.

1067  
1068 **What is the situation?**

1069 Given the invasion of Gaza by the state of Israel, concern has been raised by students from ELLS  
1070 universities that a collaboration with HUJI is problematic and unethical. Many also recognize that not all  
1071 students or faculties may agree with the views of their government or the actions of their national  
1072 military, thus collaboration with individuals is not necessarily in question. However, there are concerns  
1073 about this institutional-level collaboration as HUJI is a public university with ties to the national military,  
1074 the Israeli Defense Force (IDF).

1075  
1076 **How does HUJI engage in ELLS and by extension with NMBU?**

1077 The Hebrew University of Jerusalem (HUJI) is currently a partner university of the ELLS Alliance. HUJI is  
1078 an Israeli public research university based in Jerusalem. As a partner university, HUJI pays for  
1079 membership into ELLS. Students from HUJI are able to study abroad at ELLS universities (including  
1080 NMBU), enroll in ELLS summer schools, and participate in ELLS conferences. It also opens opportunities  
1081 for faculty mobility and joint research. As of now, it appears participation of HUJI is minimal, with a few  
1082 students participating in exchanges and conferences, but at this time, we do not have further concrete  
1083 statistics.

1084  
1085 **Why might this affiliation pose an ethical dilemma?**

1086 Part of HUJI's campus is built on occupied Palestinian territory. HUJI hosts an Israeli Defense Force (IDF,  
1087 national military) training programme and has promoted its provision of logistical equipment to military  
1088 units after the invasion of Gaza began in 2023. The chairman of the largest Israeli arms manufacturer sits  
1089 on HUJI's Board of Trustees.

1090  
1091 Several universities have cut ties with HUJI to date, and in 2025, both the Erasmus University Rotterdam  
1092 (EUR) and Maastricht University, both in the Netherlands, assessed the ethics of collaborating with HUJI.  
1093 EUR found that:

1094  
1095 "Overall, the committee considers that there are credible indications of Hebrew University's involvement  
1096 in structural violations of human rights and/or international humanitarian law (including war crimes),  
1097 directly with respect to its physical presence in Occupied Palestinian Territory (especially on land  
1098 acquired since the Occupation in 1967) and indirectly with respect to its structural entanglement with  
1099 the State of Israel and the IDF through its military programmes. Under these circumstances, collaboration  
1100 with Hebrew University puts the EUR in a position in which it may become indirectly connected to these

1101 violations, which would in turn seriously compromise the fundamental values and academic  
1102 responsibilities of the EUR.”

1109 **How has ELLS discussed this to date?**

1110 As student representatives in ELLS, we have little insight into the discussions on this. Our sense is that  
1111 there is reluctance in ELLS to take any action and rather to keep engagement at low levels. No public  
1112 statements have been made and no official positions have been taken to our knowledge.

1113  
1114 In 2025, ELLS skirted on making the decision on whether HUJI students should be allowed to participate  
1115 in the annual Student Scientific Conference and placed it on the host university in Sweden, Svensk  
1116 Landbruks University (SLU). As a public institution, SLU opted to follow the national guidelines and allow  
1117 HUJI students to participate.
